

## **AXA Achievement Scholarship**

Sponsored by the AXA Foundation in association with *U.S. News & World Report*, is open to high school seniors who plan to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college or university. Applicants must be United States citizens or legal residents and must have demonstrated ambition and self-drive as evidenced by an outstanding achievement in a school, community, or workplace activity. ## **Best Buy Scholarship**

Sponsored by the Best Buy Children's Foundation, is open to high school seniors planning to attend an accredited U.S. college or vocational school in the fall of 2008. Scholarships are awarded to students who volunteer time to their communities, excel in academics, and participate in extra curricular activities. The application must be completed electronically online; no paper applications will be accepted. The application submission deadline is February 15, 2008. No applications will be accepted after this date.

## **Kohl's Kids Who Care**

Sponsored by Kohl's Department Stores, Inc., is open to children ages 6 through 18 who reside in Kohl's Department Store communities and who have not graduated from high school as of the March 15, 2008 application postmark deadline. Kohl's Store consumers who nominate children for Kohl's Kids Who Care must be at least 21 years of age. Kohl's Department Stores employees and family members of employees are ineligible. ## **The National Multiple Sclerosis Society Scholarship Program**

Sponsored by the National Multiple Sclerosis Society Program is open to high school seniors graduating in Spring 2008 who have MS or have a parent with MS, high school graduates or GED students who have MS or have a parent with MS and who will attend a college for the first time in Fall 2008. Current college students or previous college students are not eligible to apply.

Applicants must be United States citizens or legal residents who plan to enroll in an undergraduate course of study at an accredited two-or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school located in the United States. Applicants must be enrolled at least six credit hours per semester in coursework leading to a degree, license or certificate. ## **The NSHMBA Scholarship Program**

## **The Sallie Mae Fund Unmet Need Scholarship Program**

Provides scholarships to help meet last-dollar needs of low-income students. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, have a family adjusted gross income of \$30,000 or less, demonstrate unmet financial need of at least \$1,000 after the financial aid award package has been determined and have a grade point average of 2.5 and above on a 4.0 scale. Recipients must enroll at the undergraduate level on a full-time basis at an accredited Title IV eligible institution in the U.S. or Puerto Rico. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$3,800. ## **Simon Youth Foundation Community Scholarship**

## **The USA Funds Access**

Sponsored by USA Funds, is open to financially needy students who are high school seniors, undergraduates, or graduate students. Applicants must be United States citizens or legal residents enrolled at least half time as an undergraduate, or full time as a graduate student, in an accredited institution and not in default on a student loan.
